Technology Commercialization

Abstract. This talk will cover the role of IURTC in technology transfer, IU's intellectual property policy, a brief primer on intellectual property including patents and copyrights, and IURTC's process of invention disclosure and evaluation.

About the Speakers. Dr. Jack H. Pincus is Vice President of Technology Transfer at the Indiana University Research and Technology Corporation. He manages the Office of Technology Transfer which protects, markets, and licenses IU faculty inventions. Dr. Pincus has extensive experience in technology commercialization, intellectual property management, licensing, product development, and basic and applied research. He has headed research laboratories, directed corporate research and development, and held executive marketing and business development positions. He has a B.A. in Biology a Ph.D. in Biochemistry and is a Registered Patent Agent with the United States Patent and Trademark Office.

Kurt Waldhuetter is the Associate Director for Information and Other Sciences for the Office of Technology Transfer at the Indiana University Research and Technology Corporation. Kurt covers a broad range of technologies for the university including software, informatics, multimedia content, hardware and engineering.
